- Communicate and brief collaboration partners on your management innovation findings
When universities and companies offer each other a platform to coordinate their MI findings, then both the academic and industry partners will improve sustainability.

- Advance negotiations for peaceful solutions between combatants.

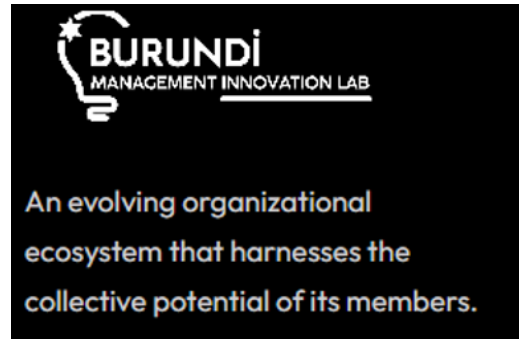
